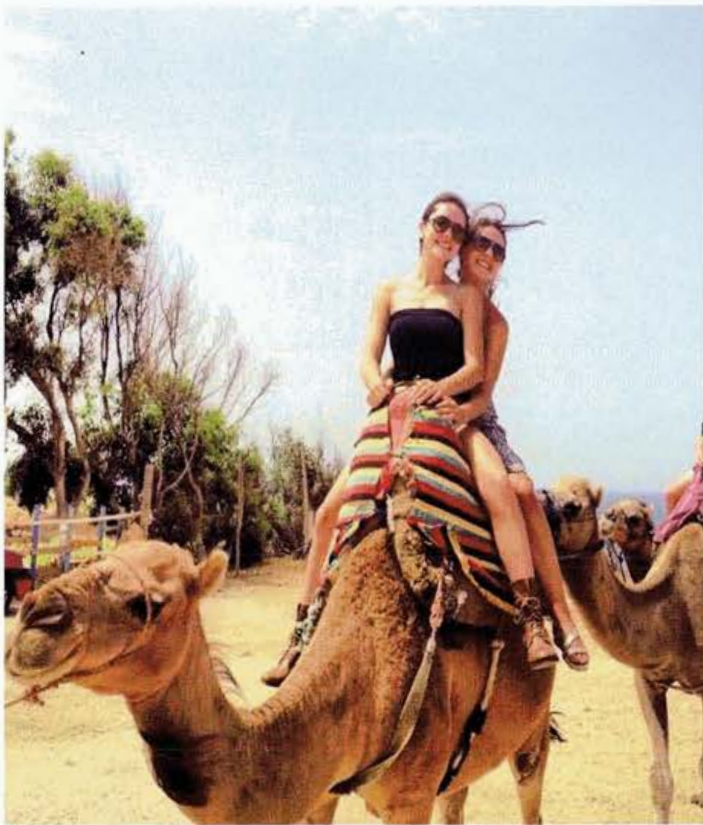

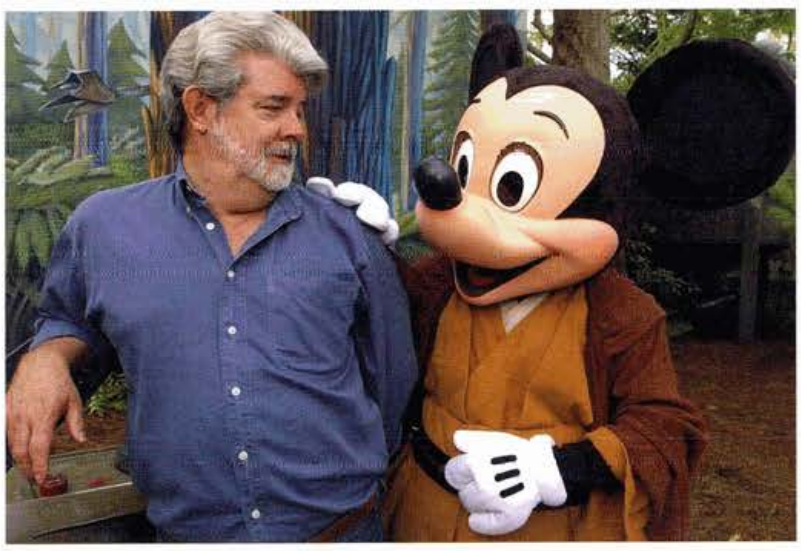

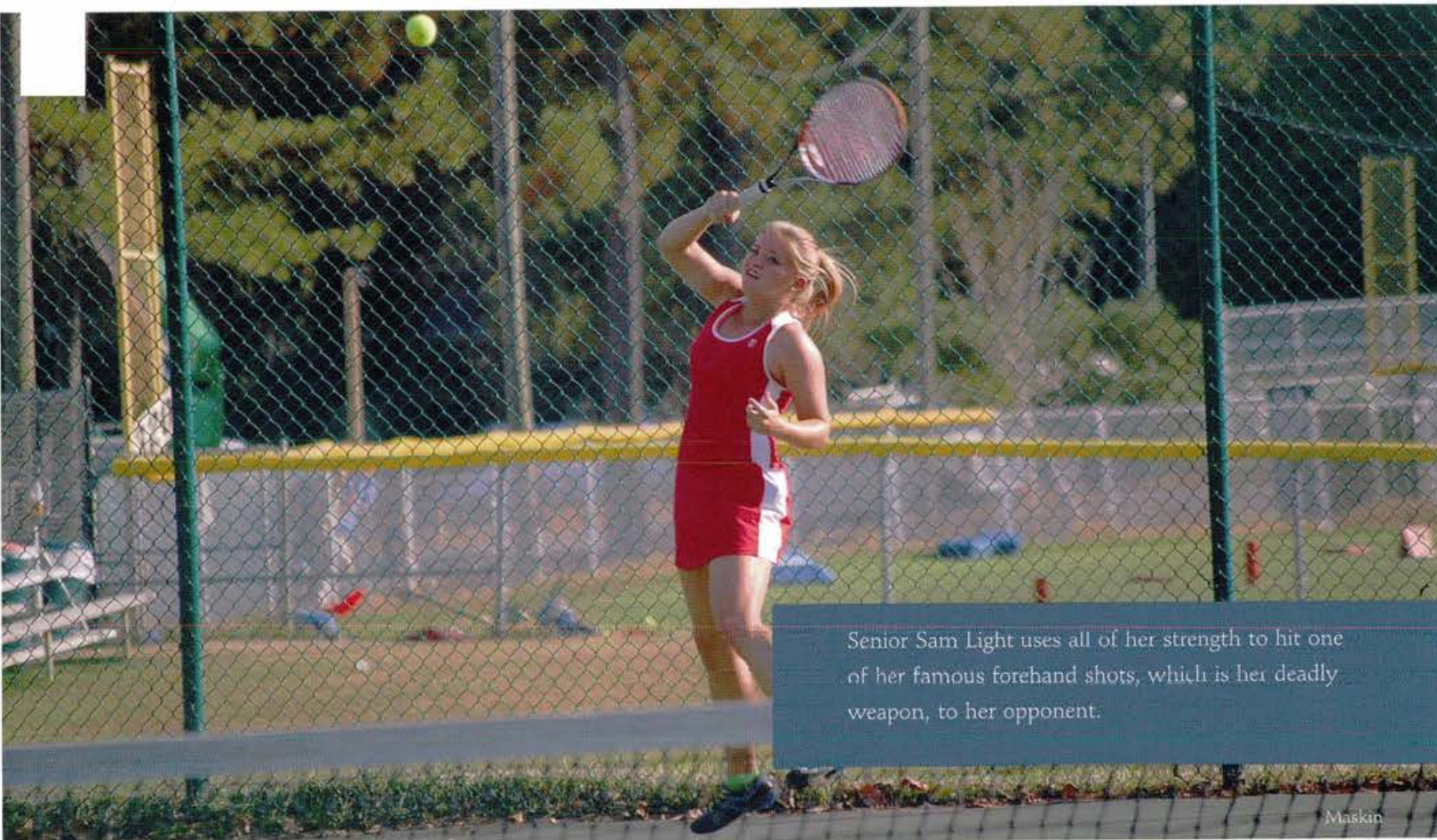
Varsity Girls Tennis

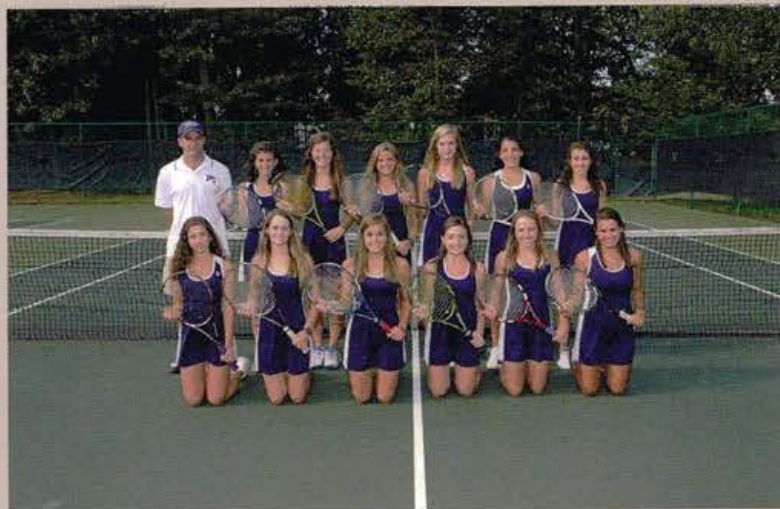

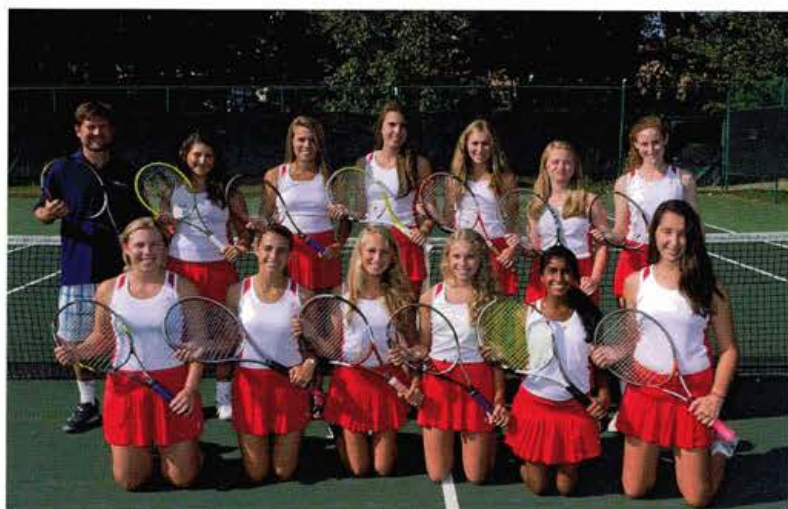
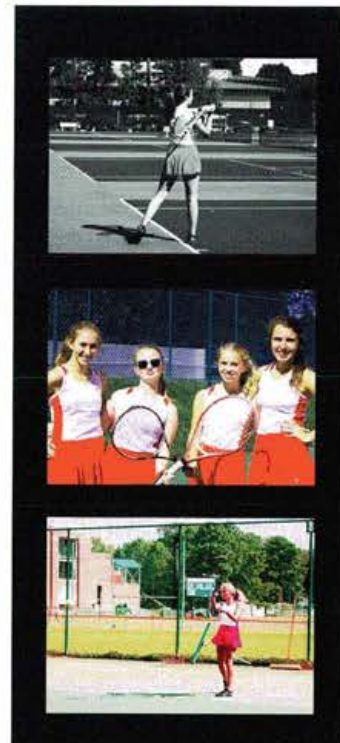
JV Girls Tennis

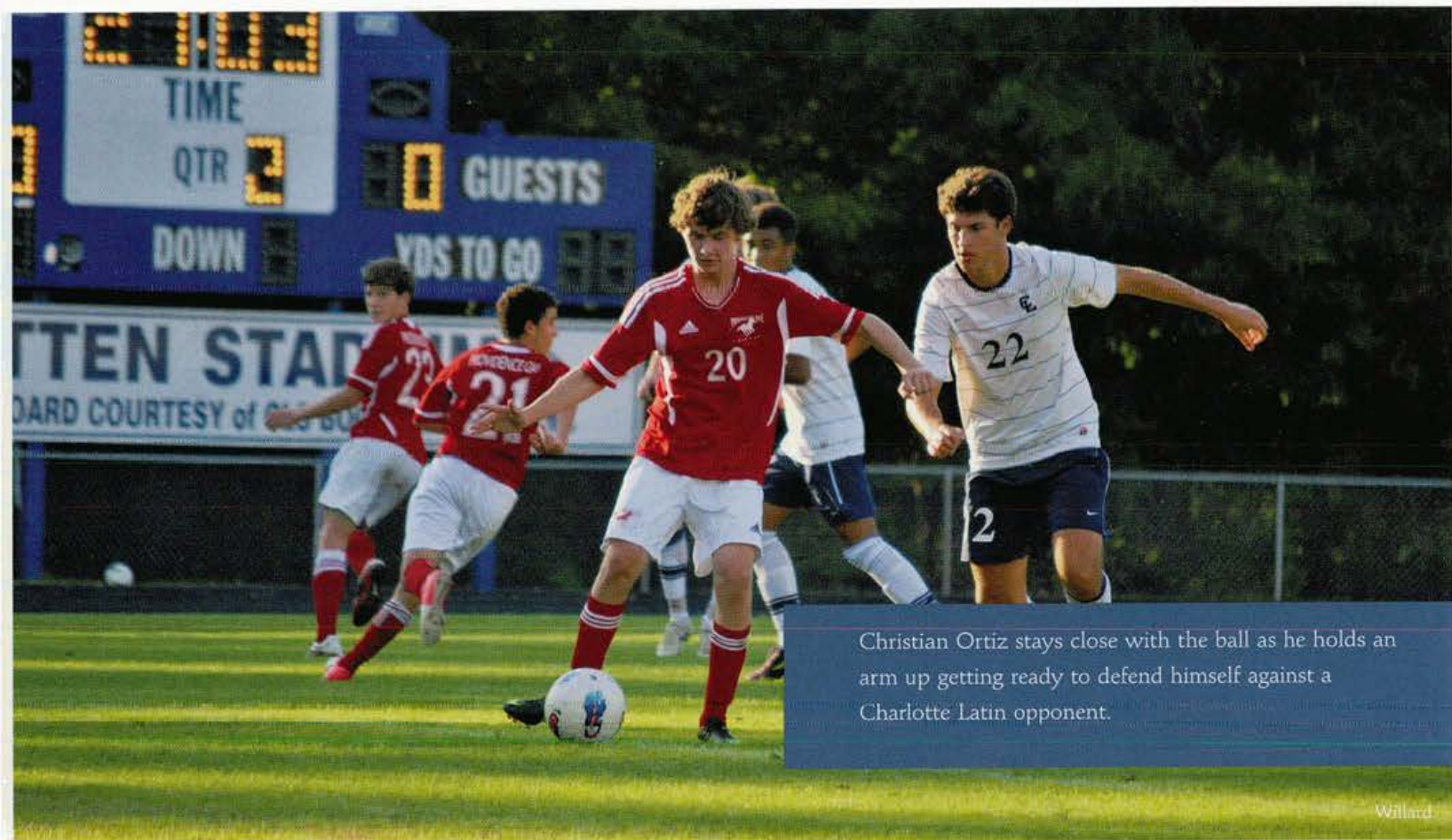
Varsity Soccer

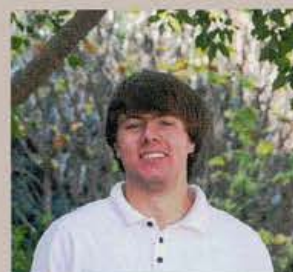

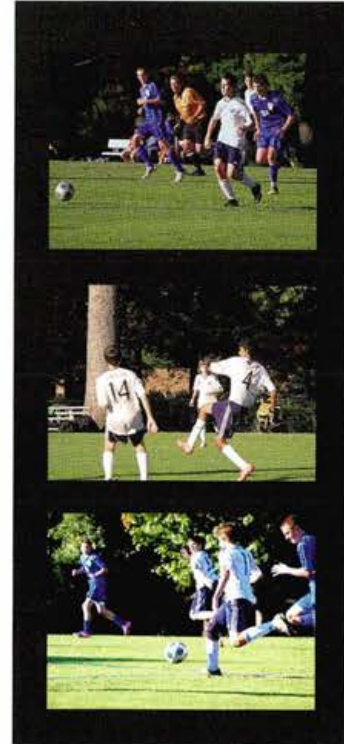
JV Boys Soccer

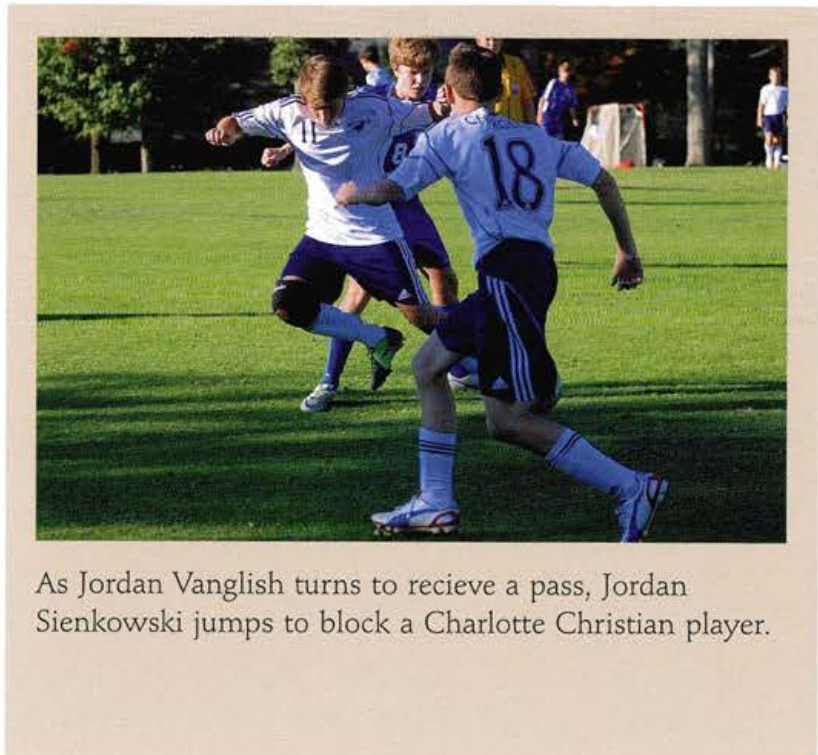

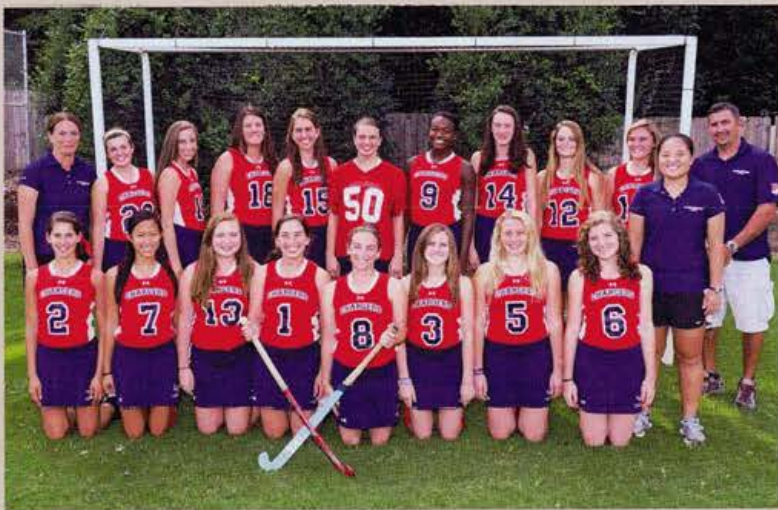

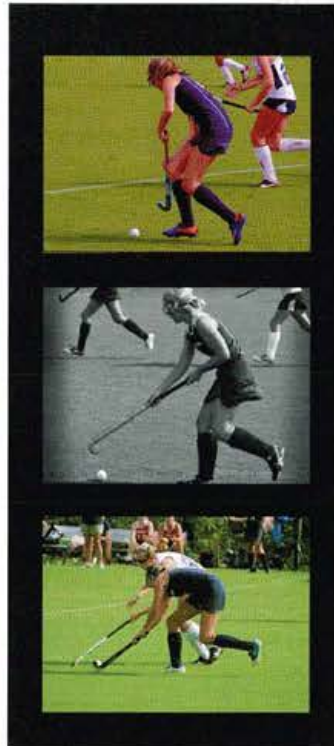
JV Field Hockey

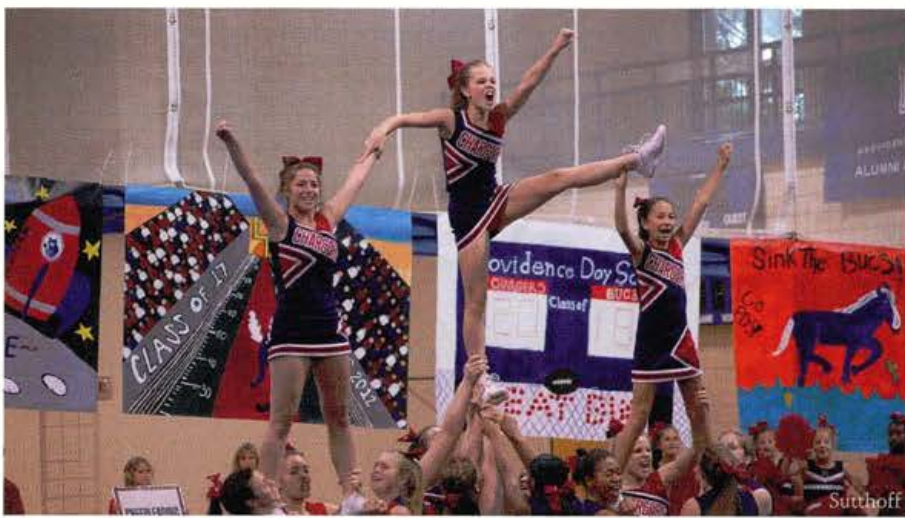

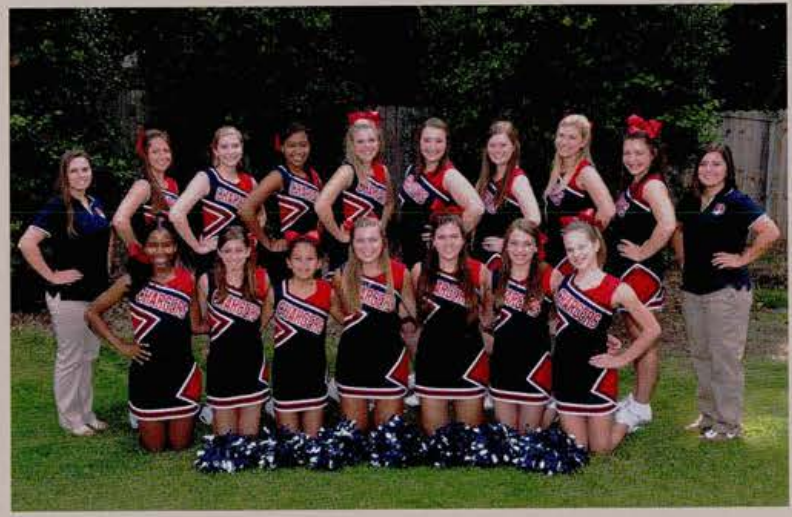

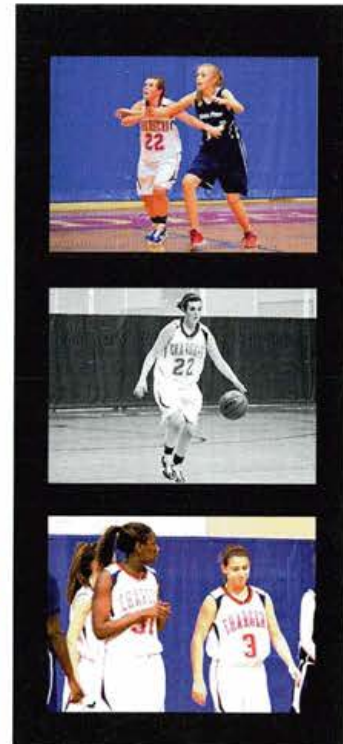

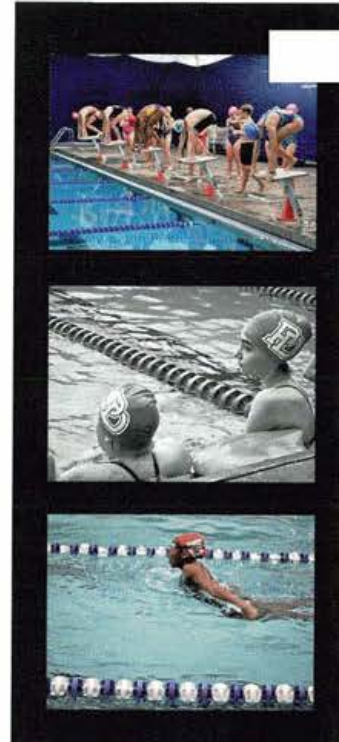
MS Swimming

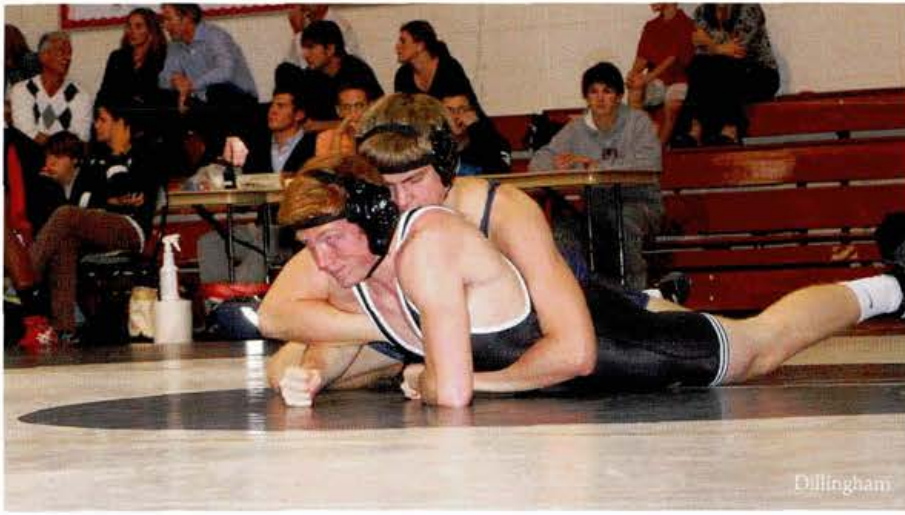

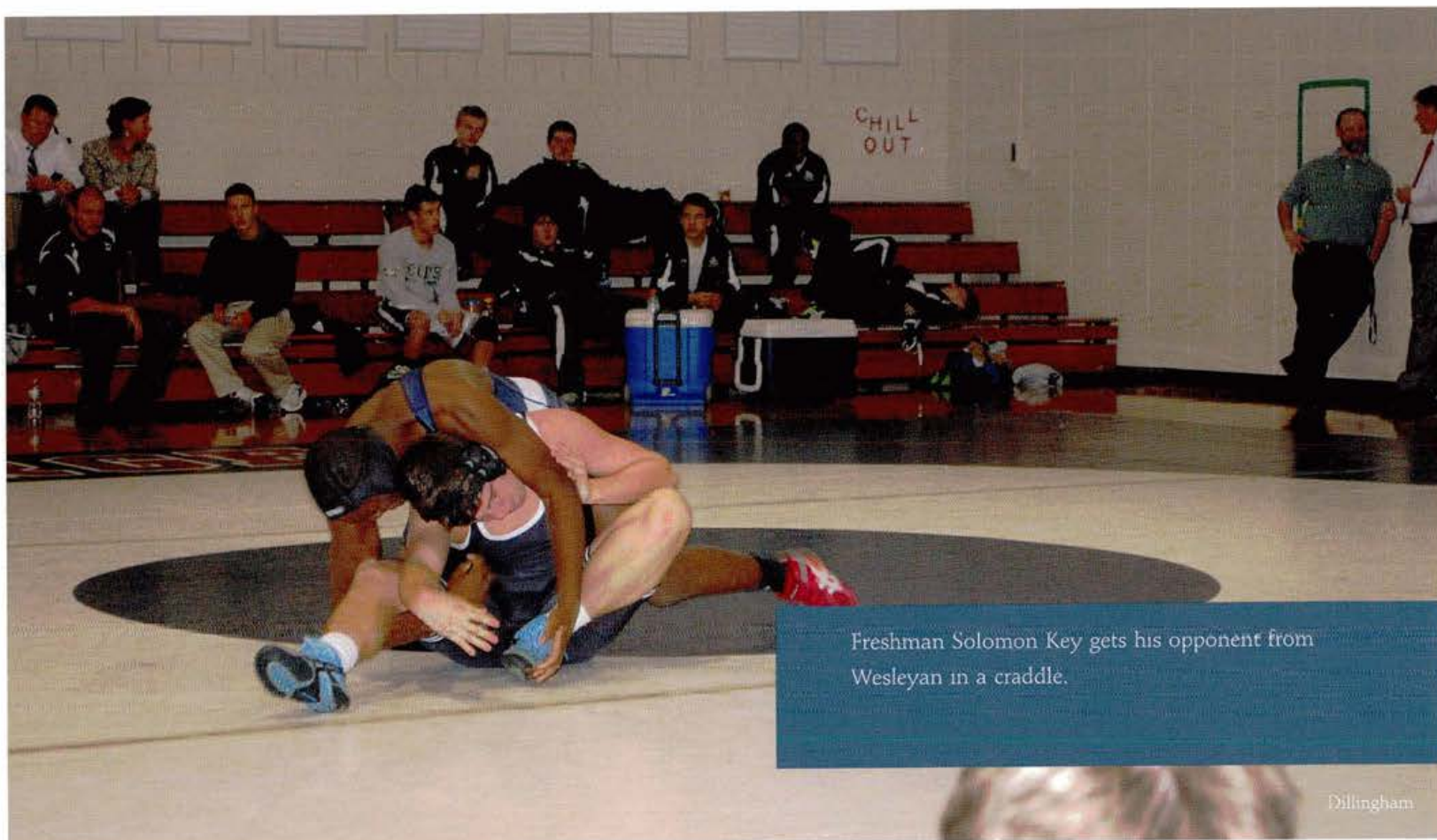
Varsity Wrestling

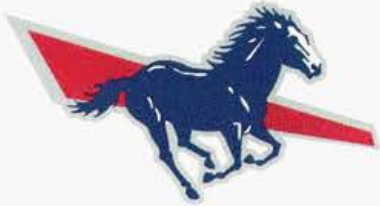
